PAREint: Testing a Novel Parenting Intervention for Autistic Children

Researchers at City, University of London are looking to compare two communication techniques that have been suggested to improve memory and communication skills in autistic children. They would like parents of autistic children to take part in a long term study, where you will receive training and support from the researchers.

In order to take part, parents and children must:

- Have access to the internet and a digital device (smart phone, tablet, computer etc.)
- Not be taking part in another research study

Children must also be:

- 7 to 11 years old
- Diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder
- Have minimal or no language or intellectual disabilities
